Lavender Foal Syndrome (LFS)



What is lavender foal syndrome (LFS)?

- Causes severe neurological dysfunction in affected foals
- Named for the characteristic coat color of affected foals
- Often associated with Egyptian Arabians
- Affected foals suffer from seizures and cannot stand to nurse.

What you can do to keep your horse healthy:

 Perform DNA testing of sires and dams prior to breeding to avoid producing affected offspring.

Signs

Seizures
Severe hyperextension
of limbs, neck, and back
Involuntary eye
movements
Inability to stand
Characteristic dilute
coat color

Transmission

Autosomal recessive mode of inheritance

Treatment

None Supportive care can provide temporary relief
